## Statement of Principles

concerning

## **MENIERE'S DISEASE**

ICD CODE: 386.0

## Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986 subsection 196B(3)

- 1. Being of the view that on the sound medical-scientific evidence available to the Repatriation Medical Authority, it is more probable than not that **Meniere's disease** and **death from Meniere's disease** can be related to eligible war service (other than operational service) rendered by veterans and defence service (other than hazardous service) rendered by members of the Forces, the Repatriation Medical Authority determines, under subsection 196B(3) of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* (the Act), that the factor that must exist before it can be said that, on the balance of probabilities, **Meniere's disease** or **death from Meniere's disease** is connected with the circumstances of that service, is:
  - (a) inability to obtain appropriate clinical management for Meniere's disease.
- 2. Subject to clause 3 (below) the factor set out in paragraph **1(a)** must be related to any service rendered by a person.
- 3. The factor set out in paragraph **1(a)** applies only where:
  - (a) the person's **Meniere's disease** developed before a period, or part of a period, of service to which the factor is related; and

- (b) the relationship suggested between the **Meniere's disease** and the particular service of the person is a relationship set out in paragraph 8(1)(e), 9(1)(e) or 70(5)(d) of the Act.
- 4. For the purposes of this Statement of Principles:

**"ICD code"** means a number assigned to a particular kind of injury or disease in the tenth edition of the *International Classification of Diseases* 9th Revision, effective date of 1 October 1993, copyrighted by the US Commission on Professional and Hospital Activities, and having the Library of Congress number 77-94472;

"Meniere's disease" means a condition characterised by sudden and recurring episodes of vertigo with nausea and vomiting, together with hearing loss and tinnitus, attracting ICD code 386.0.
