

## NOTICE OF INVESTIGATION

## Section 196G of the

Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986

The Repatriation Medical Authority (the Authority) gives notice under section 196G of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act 1986* (the VEA) that, pursuant to subsection 196B(7A) of the VEA, as there are grounds for such a review it intends to carry out an investigation in respect of the following:

- a. the definition of osteoarthritis; and
- b. repetitive activities or forceful activities of a joint of an upper limb

as factors in osteoarthritis.

This investigation will be carried out in the context of Statements of Principles Instrument Nos. 13 & 14 of 2010 concerning **osteoarthritis**.

The Authority invites the following persons and organisations to make written submissions to the Authority in respect of the investigation:

- a person eligible to make a claim for pension under Part II or Part IV of the *Veterans' Entitlements Act* 1986:
- a person eligible to make a claim for compensation under section 319 of the *Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 2004* ['the MRCA'];
- an organisation representing veterans, Australian mariners, members of the Forces, members of the Peacekeeping Forces, members within the meaning of the MRCA, or their dependants;
- the Repatriation Commission or the Military Rehabilitation and Compensation Commission; and
- · a person having expertise in a field relevant to the investigation.

The Authority will hold its first meeting for the purposes of this investigation on 5 April 2011.

All submissions must be in writing and received by the Authority at the address below no later than 28 March 2011.
